| 4   | <ul> <li>Action Items – NN noted that he had a useful meeting with MHo, David Redfern and Rhys Schell regarding engagement with Area Boards in Wiltshire. MHo noted that there are 5 Boards along the route of the canal and his initial approach will be to try to raise awareness of what WBCT is trying to achieve.</li> <li>(CG and GE joined the meeting)</li> <li>NN said that he hoped that this would be as successful as a similar initiative from the AONB's. NN said that in terms of actions the second issue was the setting up of project groups which he hoped could be defined by this meeting. MHo thought that perhaps the starting point for the project groups could be fundraising- the Melksham Link and the M4 crossing are of a size way beyond the normal small scale project funding and WBCT would be grateful for a focus on this strategic issue. NN asked if any organisation at the meeting would be able to help with this. There was no</li> </ul> |  |

KO noted that when the time was right for a Melksham group it would be appropriate for Melksham Town Council and Melksham Without Parish Council to be represented with perhaps also Canal &amp; River Trust. CG and MH agreed. NN said that this was probably a good place to start . KO noted that a group would be needed for Swindon to Royal Wootton Bassett, and for Eastern projects in the future. (<i>DE joined the meeting</i>)</li> <li>MHo said that WBCT is keen to revive interest in the towpath challenge project to create the canal towpath ahead of the full restoration and it would be useful to consider forming a towpath project group. KO suggested that could get started again if a WBCT team leader could be found- it is most likely that there would be support for a project like this from all of the Local Authorities, notwithstanding that the most challenging part of the proposal would be to engage with the landowners CG said that a walking/cycling route connecting Melksham to Lacock would be an important addition to the Link scheme. DM said he would be keen to join a towpath group to represent cycling interests.</li> <li>KO reported that he is currently in discussion with Wiltshire Council colleagues in spatial planning regarding strengthening the current Core Strategy Policy 53 (Canals) and that the Local Plan consultations are likely to take place during 2023. KO also noted that Swindon BC Local Plan is following a similar timeline.</li> <li>KO confirmed that he was now part of the Officer Place Group for Melksham.</li> <li>KO confirmed circulation of the IWA report.</li> <li>KO said there had been no progress on the MP's group – NN said that it may be wise to await the outcome of the Boundary Commission review as significant changes are proposed for constituencies that straddle the canal. 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| 5 | <ul> <li>Partnership Officer Report-         <ul> <li>M4 Crossing National Highways Designated Fund – further funding application</li> </ul> </li> <li>MHo reported that sadly NH had declined the request for funding at this stage although they remain supportive of the project- the application was for approx. £1m for a full feasibility technical study. The construction costs are likely to be in the order of £15m. KO said that having been in at the start of the discussions with Highways England (as it was at the time) he sensed that some of the reluctance may be caused by the construction costs which far exceeded any funding that may be available from NH. Other projects that have received funding have been in the order of £2-3m and it is most likely that NH would take a more positive view if they understood how the funding gap would be resolved. MHo said this would be a topic for any fundraising group.</li> <li>Melksham Link- planning application- update</li> <li>KO noted the recent meeting of the project team and EA facilitated by the planning case officer. CG also noted that the Town Council is funding an update of the feasibility study for the proposed hydro power scheme.
